




Population Change in US and NY




Population Percent Change 2020 to 2023 & 2020 to 2024

- Population loss is slowing.




2020 through 2024 ACS Population Estimates



Mid Hudson Valley, Capital region and Long Island experience population growth since 2020.








Population by County





Counties with Largest Numerical Increases & Decreases




- Orange, Suffolk and Rockland experienced most growth since 2020.
