

### Alternate Westchester Redistricting Proposal

This proposed map accurately reflects the Communities of Interest present in the Northeast Bronx, Southern Westchester, and parts of Northern Westchester. It also accounts for population change in the 5 boroughs that require Westchester Districts to shift further North.

#### Blue district:

- Includes Northeast Bronx: Co-op City, Wakefield, Edenwald, Williamsbridge
- Includes Southern Westchester with the Bronx: Mount Vernon, majority of Yonkers, New Rochelle, and Pelham COI
- Includes Sound Towns COI: Rye, Mamaroneck, Larchmont
- Keeps Hastings and Ardsley CD16. Splits the Rivertowns.
- Takes only a part of Putnam County: Kent, Carmel, Patterson, Mahopac and Brewster

#### Green district:


- Includes Dobbs Ferry, Irvington, Tarrytown, White Plains, and Ossining in one district
- Keeps White Plains and Scarsdale as a COI
- Keeps all of Rockland in the district and takes a part of Orange County

#### Pink district:

 This district would account for population growth from NYC and stretch from Riverdale into the Southern east portion of Yonkers (north of Van Cortlandt Park).



## Greenburgh split blue/green border



Both Hastings on Hudson and Ardsley must remain in CD16 and Greenburgh is best represented with two representatives. Keeping Greenburgh in one Congressional district is a change that would disrupt the current positive representation from two members of Congress.

# Yonkers Split and connected to NW Bronx



The proposed map proposes that the population loss that is needed in order to account for the downstate population growth come by taking a chunk of the Yonkers and connecting it to the district taking the NW Bronx. This is represented by the pink district.

The Blue map represents the Northeast Bronx connection to Southern Westchester that many identified as a community of interest.

New Rochelle should not be connected to Queens and must stay in CD16.
