I am submitting a map that removes a portion of the 60<sup>th</sup> Assembly District's proposed maps northern border, between Liberty Avenue to Atlantic Avenue and Van Sinderen Avenue to Pennsylvania Avenue. I request this area be removed from the proposed map because that area houses several shelters and our district is currently oversaturated with shelters, to add more would be unbalanced and inequitable. The map I am submitting also proposes adding a comparable amount of land on the western border in order to compensate the area I am requesting to remove. I propose that this area in the west remain in our district to meet the population standards of the redistricting but also because over the last ten years we have done a lot of great work in that area. Since the last redistricting we have added affordable housing, renovated parks and supported renovations to the Brownsville Recreation Center in that area of our district.
